Youngsters can now watch their favourite football stars during the Soccer World Cup, thanks to the installation of a sun TV station at the Gansbaai Communal Sports Centre that was handed over on Saturday during the FFSA's Foundation Cup.

Kat Myburgh, Area Manager of the Gansbaai Administration accepted the keys to the cabinet in which the TV has been placed. "We are extremely fortunate to receive this. A lot of children will benefit from this, even after the World Cup. The television will then be used for education and training purposes in our community," Myburgh said.

As part of the Absa Spaces for Sports centre and the Football Foundation's edu-

cation programme, SolarWorld AG equipped the centre with this station that will give the youngsters access to television transmissions and to modern media. The station will in addition to the solar modules, batteries and charging devices for the power supply, be equipped with a DVD player and a television set with satellite receiver.

It is furthermore designed to promote a community spirit in Gansbaai. Through the Dibanisa programme, the media will mainly focus on education, social integration and environmental awareness. The climate-friendly power supply of the station is designed to also make people aware of climate protection.
